St. John's Northwestern Military Academy challenges cadets to learn leadership principles in the classroom through the U.S. Army JROTC program. Cadet leaders use after school time and weekends to hone their leadership skills at all levels. Cadet leaders are selected based on demonstrated maturity, academic performance and sense of responsibility.



St. John's Northwestern Prefect Academy educates and develops young men and women into responsible citizens and moral leaders using contemporary organizational leader development principles.

St. John's Northwestern Middle School Academy, Grades 6-8
Sixth, seventh and eighth grade students study English, mathematics, science, social studies, physical education, fine arts, technology, and leadership skills. Qualified eighth graders may take electives in world language or freshman-level course work for high school credit.



St. John's Northwestern Summer Academy offers summer fun with the purpose of providing character-building leadership skills through summer academic and challenging outdoor programs.

DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION

St. John's Northwestern Academies is an independent, coed, college preparatory and leader development boarding and day school for grades 6-12 located in Delafield, Wisconsin, 25 miles west of Milwaukee and 95 miles northwest of Chicago. The 110 acre campus includes several buildings that house classrooms, learning commons, residence halls, dining hall, chapel, infirmary, student center, gym, and pool, along with athletic fields and a nine-hole golf course. Annual enrollment is approximately 200 students from across the United States and numerous international countries.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADES 9-12

Graduation requires a minimum of 27* academic credits: 4 of English, 3 of math, 3 of social studies, 3 of science, 2 of world language, 1 of technology, 1 of fine art, 1.5 of physical education, and one unit of leadership every year of attendance.
