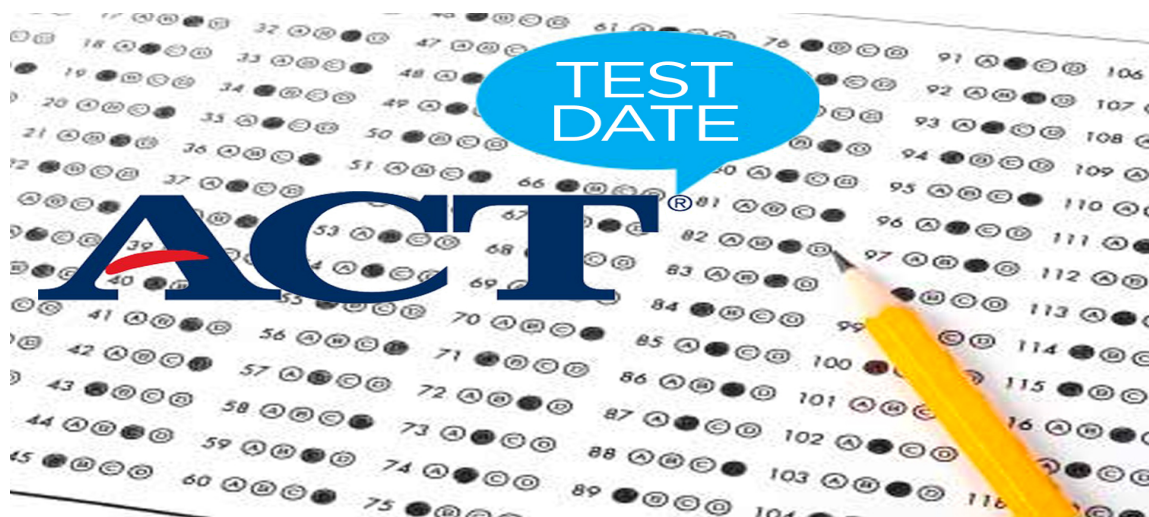




Online, Self-Paced ACT and SAT Prep

Throughout the year, SJNA hosts mandatory testing for juniors, sophomores, freshman and 8th graders. Juniors and Seniors will take the ACT and SAT, which are entrance exams used by most colleges and universities to make admissions decisions. In addition, sophomores and 8/9 graders will also be taking tests; 10th graders are taking the Pre-ACT and the 8/9th graders will be taking the Pre-ACT 8/9. These Pre-ACTs help measure college readiness and can be used to predict how students are likely to do when they take the ACT as 11th graders. Along with the impact standardized tests have on admission chances, many colleges offer merit scholarships based on standardized test scores as well. So, studying hard for the ACT can not only help students get into school, but it may also help them pay for tuition also!



All SJNA high schoolers receive free accounts in Methodize Test Prep – an online learning platform designed to help students prepare for ACT and SATs. It is a self-paced course and a simple, effective tool that empowers students to learn by using custom-built courses that consist of lessons, units, quizzes and tests. Not only will students be tested on their comprehension of the concepts being taught, but this program also features tutoring elements and gives students a chance to review detailed text and video explanations of the correct answers.
