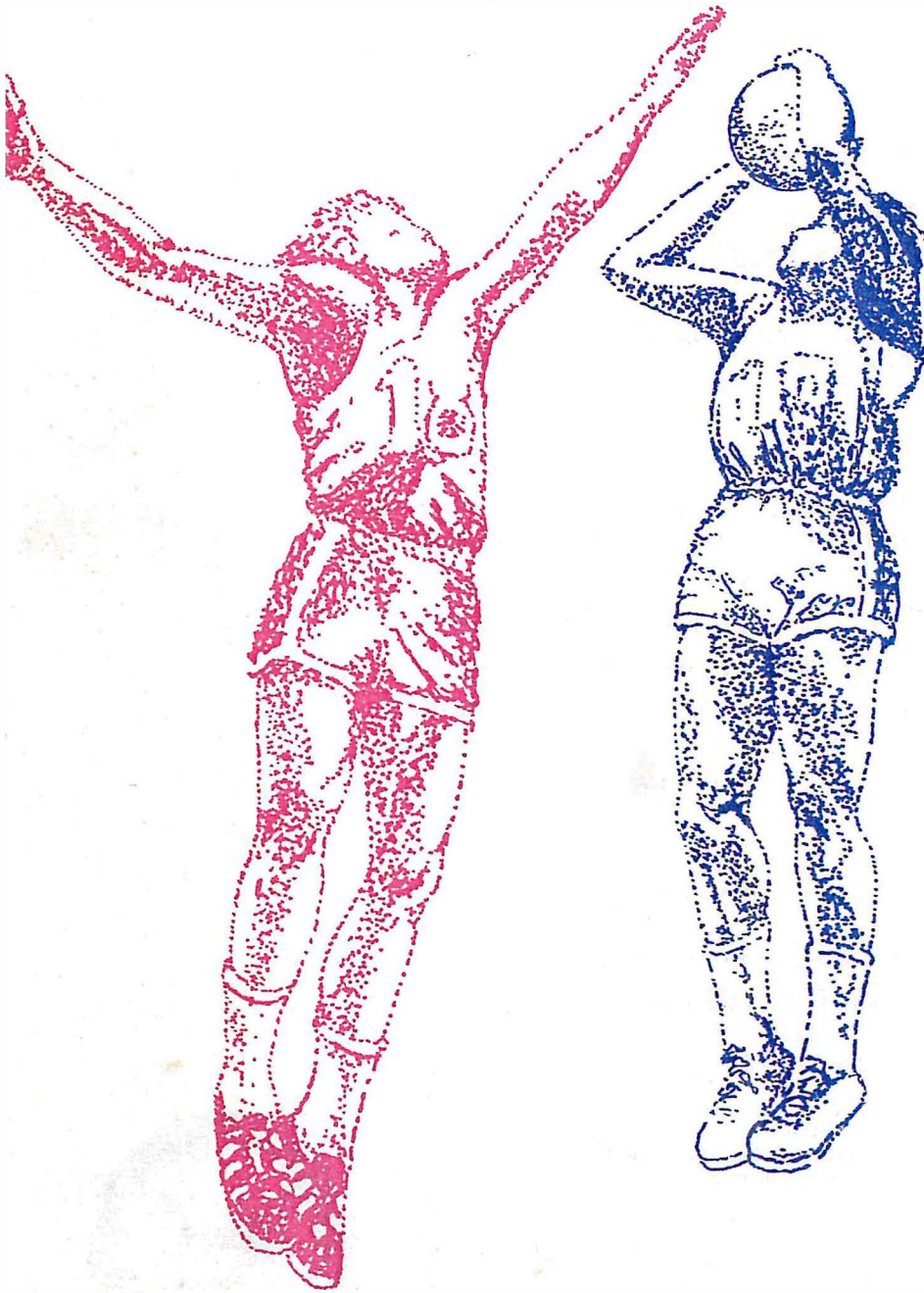


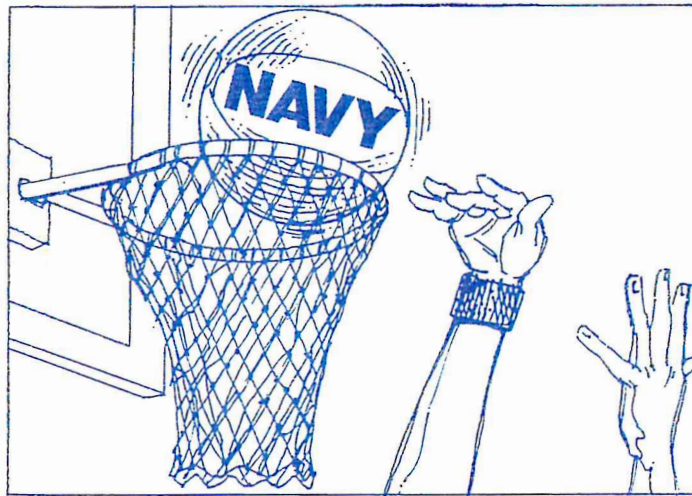

WISAA — AN AMAZING 20 YEARS!

It's amazing! What's amazing? The difference between the Association which today provides a statewide interscholastic athletic program for non-public high schools in Wisconsin from that of 20 years ago.

It's not unusual, of course, for changes to occur to any person or group over that period of time. But we feel that those which have taken place within the Association are significant enough that they bear recounting on the occasion of the group's 20th anniversary. In fact, some have been so drastic that those who planned the organization before it was launched wouldn't recognize it as it appears today. Especially if they have been absent from the scene even a few years of these past two decades.

For example, something even as basic as the Association's name is different! For in 1957, when the present Wisconsin Association of Principals of Catholic Secondary Schools (WAPCSS) founded the organization, its membership consisted solely of Catholic schools and it operated under the banner of the Wisconsin Catholic Interscholastic Athletic Association (WCIAA).

Comprised of 34 members during its initial year, WCIAA rolls gradually grew to 41 by 1967. Then on July 1, 1968, a revolutionary change occurred. WCIAA opened its doors to all non-public high schools in the state and was re-christened the Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association (WISAA). This had the immediate effect of adding 13 schools, increasing the group's membership to 54. Today's WISAA serves 59 institutions. And next fall, when Manitowoc Lutheran joins in competition, the organization will match its 1975 all-time high enrollment of 60 members. Among these may be found Baptist, Catholic, Christian Reformed, Lutheran, military and other schools without religious affiliation. Quite a difference from its makeup in 1957!

Many of this year's basketball tourney fans undoubtedly wouldn't recognize the names of some of the schools which appeared in the tourney series of 20 years ago. For instance, who remembers Mauston Madonna, Lima Sacred Heart, Ashland De Padua, Milwaukee St. Benedict, St. Nazianz St. Gregory, Marinette Lourdes? Or how many recall Superior Cathedral, Little Chute St. John, De Pere St. Norbert, Milwaukee Don Bosco? Also, in competition the Association's first year were Milwaukee Cathedral and Prairie du Chien Champion. As such, all the afore have since disappeared from the Association's scene. Many new names have been added in their stead. And to point up the ever-changing complexion of the body, three newcomers entered competition just this year! They are Kenosha Shoreland Lutheran, Fond du Lac Winnebago Lutheran and Jackson Kettle Moraine Lutheran.

The heart of any association is in its program. Two decades ago, the old WCIAA was committed to conducting only a state basketball series. It approved sponsorship of...but was not definitely committed to...state meets in baseball, golf, tennis, track and wrestling...all for boys only! In this sense, today's

WISAA is vastly different and now totally involved. For it has assumed an obligation to annually provide state tournament competition in a total of nine boy sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, track and wrestling.

With respect to the sport of football, an historic event came in 1969. That year, WISAA dared to do what no other midwestern state was doing. And that was to introduce a state football championship series. The innovation proved to be an immediate success! It marked another big change in the life of WISAA and paved the way for subsequent program growth.

An additional spectacular development occurred in 1972. That year all-girls schools were admitted into the Association! Yes, that's right. Girls' schools! Five joined: Green Bay St. Joseph Academy, Milwaukee Divine Savior/Holy Angels, St. Joan Antida, Mercy (since dissolved) and St. Mary's Academy. The fairer sex ceased to be spectators. They became participants!

The entry of all-girls schools was simultaneous with the adoption of a girls' interscholastic athletic program, the same year. Two state meets were immediately conducted. In volleyball and track. Soon to follow were championships in tennis and basketball. And this spring, a fifth . . . softball . . . makes its debut. WISAA was involved in a whole new ball game. Something its founders never envisioned!

Was it less of a surprise, then, that fast upon the heels of the implementation of a girls' program a woman should be hired to the organization's staff? It happened in 1973, in the person of Mrs. Pauline Thelen who, since, has been successfully guiding the fortunes of their destiny. And shouldn't a woman also have a say in deciding rules and regulations which steer the future course of WISAA? The principals of the state's member schools thought so. And just this past fall they moved in that direction by electing the first active non-male Board of Control member. She is Sister Electa Armstrong, principal of Whitefish Bay Dominican. The day of all-male direction and participation within WISAA had come to an abrupt end!

There are many other examples of transformations since 1957 which clearly differentiate the Association of yesteryear and today and speak for themselves. Lay members largely staff member schools, serve as athletic directors, sit on the WISAA Board, positions practically all previously held by religious. The Chairman of WCIAA in its early years was Monsignor Vernon J. Kuehn, then principal of Milwaukee Messmer. Today's Chairman is John Bleeke, principal of Racine Lutheran. The list of surprises could go on and on.

Yes, the Association of today IS vastly changed from that of 1957. But isn't it amazing "WHAT" has happened in the brief span of these past 20 years. One wonders what it will be like in 1997. That year may hold as many surprises for current WISAA-goers as 1977 brought to the founders of WCIAA!

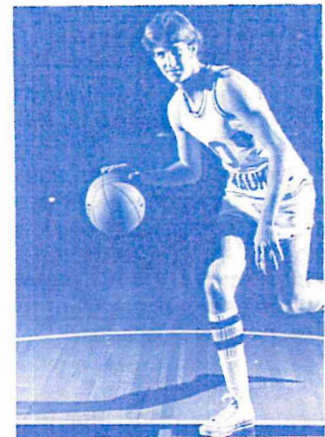

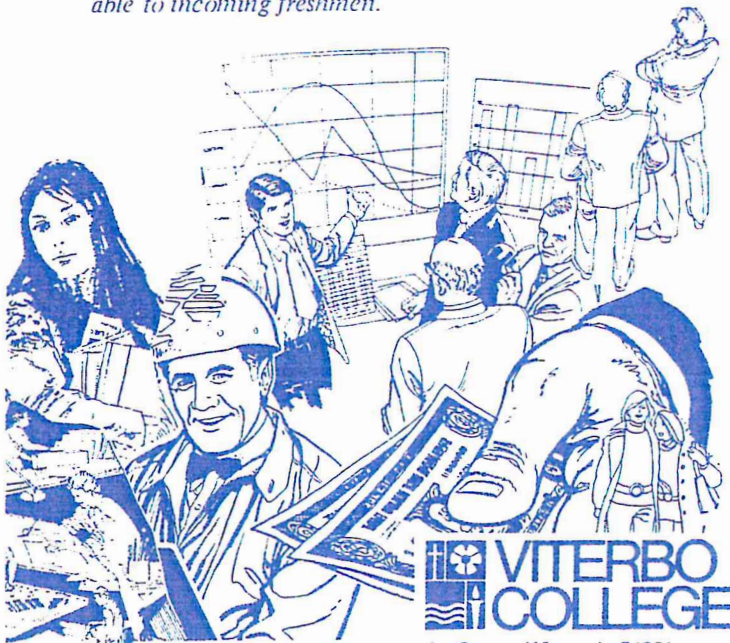

WISAA MAN OF THE YEAR



**WALT
KROLL**

Annually, the Marquette University Tip-Off Club sponsors and presents an award to a person selected by the Board of Control as WISAA Man of the Year. The man chosen for the honor must have made a significant contribution to the Association's program. Unanimously named to receive the award this year is a person whose name is familiar to his community and state as well . . . WALT KROLL. The presentation will take place just prior to the Championship Finals on Sunday.

He stands tall. Not only in stature but as a person as well. For he is not content to do only that which is expected of him; rather, his magnanimity reaches out to all with whom he comes in contact; fellow faculty, the students he instructs and coaches, fans, members of his community, contemporaries, the Association he has so loyally served these past 13 years. Not flamboyant, his warm personality captivates. Quietly. Quickly. You like WALT KROLL. And so does WISAA. As its Man of the Year for 1977!

Walt has contributed most significantly to the success of the Wisconsin Independent Schools Athletic Association. He is a charter member of WISAA's football committee and was a prime mover in inaugurating and implementing the group's football championship series, the first in the Midwest, in 1969. During the past nine seasons, his keen managerial ability has marked the boys' regional basketball meet at Marshfield as one of the best in the state. Annually! Besides, he holds the distinction of having directed the organization's most successful grid playoff game in series history. At Marshfield. In 1975. And for the past five years, when WISAA struggled for sites and a person to manage the fledgling girls' regional cage meets, who stepped forward to offer assistance? Walt Kroll! His loyalty to and interest in his Association is unquestioned.

Born and reared in Glenwood City, Wisconsin, our Man of the Year spread his athletic talents at the local public high school among the sports of football, basketball and baseball, graduating in 1947. Thereafter, for three years, he was employed at the Ford Motor Assembly plant in St. Paul, before Uncle Sam claimed him for two years of Army duty, most of which was spent as a special service athlete in Germany where he coached U.S. football teams.

Bent upon continuing his education and satisfying fully a burning desire to become a football coach, Walt then enrolled at the University of Minnesota, where he won a B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1957.

The foundation for his highly successful grid coaching career, which today stamps him as one of Wisconsin's most respected mentors, was laid at Rockford High School, Minnesota. Here, he initiated the school's football program, besides coaching track and teaching physical education, from 1957-59.

Next, it was on to Owen-Withee High School, Wisconsin, from 1959-61, where he tutored winning teams in football and track, before returning to the home of the Gophers for graduate study in 1961-62. He then moved to Milwaukee Lincoln High School, 1962-64, serving as head track and assistant football coach. Two of his students here were NBA star Freddy Brown and former Badger cage ace Clarence Sherrod.

The move that was to bring him his greatest fame came in 1964, when he was contracted to be head football and cinder coach at Marshfield Columbus High School, positions he has held for the past 13 years, besides serving as the Don's athletic director the last 11 seasons.

He catapulted Columbus to the WCIAA (WISAA) State Class B track championship in 1966. In 1970, his thinclads were Central Wisconsin Catholic Conference (CWCC) outdoor track champions. As well, he points with pride to leading squads to Milwaukee City Conference indoor and outdoor titles and the Madison West Relays crown, earlier in his track coaching career.

Although highly-regarded as a track coach, it is his genius as a football mentor which has gained for him his greatest prominence. Over 100 times he has left the gridiron a winner. At Columbus alone, he has etched an envious 80-40-2 log, winning or tying for the conference (CWCC) championship in 1967, 1974 and 1975. In 1974, his team was runnerup in the WISAA State Football Championship, losing the title game, 15-14, when a last second field goal attempt hit the post and went awry. The following year, Kroll's gridders were again selected to compete as one of the top four independent schools in the state. But the real wizardry of the man from Glenwood City lies not in his record; rather in HOW he has been able to accomplish what he has. For his school, Columbus, enrolls less than 200 boys! And, competes against schools much larger in size! Small wonder that colleagues saw fit to name him as their Conference Football Coach of the Year in 1970, 1974, 1975 and 1976!

One of the highest statewide tributes paid Kroll's football coaching expertise came recently when he was selected as one of the men to direct the North team in the First Annual Wisconsin Shrine North-South All-Star Football Game to be staged next July.

Currently president of the Central Wisconsin Catholic Conference, Walt lists reading as his main hobby, especially World War II periodicals which dominate his huge library at home. Between the latter and the numerous hours he so unselfishly gives to the students and athletes at Columbus, his bachelor life is directed to enhancing his astute football coaching skills by attending annual NCAA conventions, bowl games (anywhere in the country) and spring practices at universities like Notre Dame. His hero is Ara Parseghian, former coach of the Fighting Irish.

Mark well the name of WALT KROLL. For he's certain to continue as one of the greatest influences on youth and football in years to come. WISAA is justifiably proud to list him as its celebrated Man of the Year for 1977!
