DESCRIPTION AND LOCATION

St. John's Northwestern Academies is an independent, coed, college preparatory and leadership development boarding and day school for grades 6-12, located in Delafield, Wisconsin, 25 miles west of Milwaukee and 95 miles northwest of Chicago.

We have a diverse global population with students from all across the United States and world, and an average annual enrolment of 180 students. Our campus includes several buildings that house classrooms, learning commons, residence halls, a dining hall, chapel, infirmary, athletic fields, gym, pool, and campus store.

Honors program features **AP** and college courses, with **STEM** and **Humanities** Honors Diplomas.

Students regularly engage in **community service activities**.

The **student/teacher ratio** is approximately **10:1**.

Individualized attention in our **tutorial program** and **after school guided study halls**.

Specialty programs include **aviation, drone pilot certification, bagpipes** and **Scottish drumming**.

EXTRACURRICULAR

All students participate in a leadership program and athletics. Club opportunities are available throughout the year. Community service and civic engagement activities are an important part of student life.

MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES 6-8

Sixth, seventh and eighth grade students study English, mathematics, science, social studies, physical education, leadership and an elective in fine arts and technology. Qualified eighth graders may take electives in world language or freshman-level math for high school credit.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADES 9-12

Graduation requires a minimum of 24 academic credits: 4 of English, 3 of math, 3 of social studies, 3 of science, 2 of world language, 1 of technology, 1 of fine art, 1.5 of physical education and health, 0.5 of college and career planning, and at least 2.0 of leadership.

Diploma Options: College Preparatory, STEM Honors and Humanities Honors.

Honors Program. Honors, AP and college level courses are available in most core disciplines.

English as a Second Language (ESL): ESL courses are offered from beginning to advanced levels for international students needing ESL support. Most students in the ESL program are also integrated into many mainstream classes.

Transfer Credit. Credit from other accredited schools is accepted when course work satisfies our requirements.

Our admissions team works with each applicant to assess and recommend the best opportunity for each student.

FACULTY

Faculty totals 33, of which 19 hold Master's degrees, and 2 hold doctorate degrees. Teachers also bring years of experience from former careers within their fields.
